Re: COVID-19 Provincial Health Order (Revised March 29, 2021)

Indoor Worship Services SUSPENDED

The B.C. government announced today that new COVID-19 restrictions have been implemented across the province as cases continue to surge. Premier John Horgan, Dr. Bonnie Henry and Health Minister Adrian Dix, announced that all **indoor** dine-in service, group fitness, **worship services** and non-essential travel will be banned for three weeks amid rising coronavirus case counts.

The new restrictions take effect at midnight on Monday, March 29, 2021 and will be in place until Monday, April 19 (at least). The class variance announced late last week for limited indoor worship services has now been suspended. Indoor in-person religious gatherings and worship services of any size are now prohibited, with the exception of Baptisms, Weddings, and Funerals (with no more than 10 people in the church).

Outdoor worship services under the current variance may continue provided the Directives for outdoor religious gatherings are respected. Pastors are under no obligation to have outdoor gatherings.
